Pledge of Allegiance

Klipstein/Garvin motion to approve minutes. All ayes. Carried.

Public Comment:

None

Communications:

Mayor – None, except that Pfof will be limited to the number of Council meetings as he is traveling for work usually the second week of the month and this will go on until July. Need to consider alternate days for the Council meeting to include Pfof.

Klipstein – received a complaint about a truck on Riverview – it will be moved as she talked to them. Also talked to them about junk and they will clean it up at Spring Clean-up. Also, there is an unregistered vehicle at Johnson home on Riverside.

Steward – asked Council about attendance at certain events in the packet.

Agenda:

Ordinance 407 – Annexation

Garvin wants CSM attached to ordinance.

Garvin/Huber motion to approve Ordinance 407 annexing land from the Town of Plymouth to the City of Elroy and noted on CSM 4416. Roll call. All ayes. Carried.

Resolution 978 – Authorizing the issuance of a \$260,000 Taxable Tax Increment Revenue Bond

Garvin presented the \$260,000 taxable tax increment revenue bond. The CDA and he recommend that all the revenues from the Bardo tax increment be applied towards payment for the bond.

Steward explained that the payment for the bond needs to be appropriated annually by the Council.

Garvin/Lindemann motion to approve Resolution 978 with all revenue from Bardo to go towards paying the revenue bond. Roll call. All ayes. Carried.

Resolution 979 – Partnership for Prosperity Agenda support

Garvin explained the resolution as developed by the League of Wisconsin Municipalities.

Garvin/Klipstein motion to approve Resolution 979. Roll call. All ayes. Carried.

Tilmar property sale discussion:

Steward updated the Council that the counter offer was not accepted, so the deal is dead.

City Hall Architecture Report:

Steward reported that progress is being made but there is a delay in the completion due to changes with the Architectural Firm. The final report will give options and choices. Steward and Garvin will meet with the Architect in the next few weeks.

MG&E Discussion:

Steward presented that MG&E will be closing there Elroy office to walk in customers in the near future and they are looking for a payment station and they have asked the City. I spoke with the software manufacturer and MG&E management about the process to handle payments. They say it takes 30 seconds but I know it takes 5 minutes or more. I discussed this with staff and they were not too excited about it. We may be able to generate another \$2000 in revenue for doing this, but there could be headaches and other setbacks. If time allows, Carole Brown and I will go to MG&E and check out their process.

The Council expressed their concern with this idea and not too thrilled about it.

Burn permit – Schroeder

Garvin/Huber motion to approve burn permit for Schroeder per recommendations of the Fire Chief. All ayes. Carried.

ATV Ordinance:

Steward presented request by Kris Yager and others who want ATV use on City of Elroy streets. Garvin wants an ordinance ready for review at the March meeting. Lindemann and Klipstein think it will bring in more tourism. Council would like to see Kris Yager at the next meeting and to bring a sample ordinance.

Expenditures:

In the amount of \$245,725.30

Garvin/Huber motion to approve bills. Roll call. All ayes. Carried.

Citation/housing inspection update.

Steward updated on 1416/1421 Academy and 306 2nd Main Street. We have access to 1416/1421 Academy and will conduct an inspection. 306 2nd Main costs to repair exceed the 50% threshold and can be razed.

It will take 30 to 90 days to take formal action after we get the current 3 or 4 down.

Utility Commission Update:

Steward updated on the Utility Commission

Community Development Update:

Garvin updated on Bardo and loan and WEDC grant. Should hear in early March. Taking down Hawkhunter building. Façade improvement program - \$5000 available – now have 4 businesses interested. Theater is #1 on list.

Streets update:

Huber – tree cutting update is 1 tree per week, minimum, cemetery headstone work has been contacted, sidewalk letters will be going out end of month. 2015 street projects and funding include a

DOT meeting in March at High School, demo of buildings, identifying alleys for repair, concrete and dirt can go to Midor for fill and sidewalk removal on Franklin Street in spring.

Finance update:

No meeting.

Ordinance update:

Klipstein updated on the discussion of Title 2 of the ordinance. Looking to make minor changes. Things needed in ordinance include wellhead protection plan, cross connection and well abandonment ordinance. Kennel and dog licensing will be revisited again. Will review 10-2-7 thru 10 for housing.

WHEREAS, adoption of said Ordinance is in the best interests of the citizens and residents of Juneau County;







7.17 ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTES AND OPERATION

(1) INTENT

Following due consideration of the recreational and economic value to connect trail opportunities and weighted against possible dangers, public health, liability aspects, terrain involved, traffic density and history of automobile traffic, this ordinance has been created pursuant to County Board authority under Wis. Stats. §§ 59.02, 23.33(11)(am) and 23.33(8)(b), as amended.

(2) ATV ROUTES

(a) County trunk highways designated as ATV routes shall be established and approved by the Juneau County Highway and Public Works Committee ("the Highway Committee") and the Juneau County Board of Supervisors. The Highway Committee shall develop policies and procedures for designation of ATV routes including appropriate criteria for making a designation. Any modification to a designated ATV route shall be approved by the Highway Committee. A copy of ATV routes, along with a map showing their location, shall be kept on file at the Highway Department. The Juneau County Highway Department shall have the authority to close or terminate any ATV route on the County Trunk Highway System, subject to approval by the Highway Committee.

(b) The following routes are established:

1. County Highway H, from 9th Street to Highway 173 in the Town of Kingston, with a length of approximately 1.6 miles.
2. County Highway F, from 12th Avenue North to 9th Avenue North in the Town of Finley, with a length of approximately 2.09 miles.

(3) ATV ROUTES ONLY ON ROADWAY

All ATV's shall operate only on the paved portion of the roadway. Operation on the gravel shoulders, grassy in-slope, ditches, or other highway right-of-way is prohibited and illegal.

(4) OPERATION OF ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES ON COUNTY HIGHWAYS

(a) All ATV operators shall observe posted roadway speed limits for ATV operation.

(b) All ATV operators shall ride in single file on the right hand side of the paved portion of the highway.

(c) All ATV operators shall have their headlight illuminated, and taillight if available, while operating on a county highway.

(d) All ATV operators who are born after January 1, 1988, and operating on a county highway are required to have an ATV Safety Certificate. No one under 12 years of age is allowed to operate an ATV on a county highway.

(e) All ATV operators and passengers under 18 years old shall wear protective headgear while operating on county highways.

(5) SIGNAGE OF ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTES

(a) Pursuant to Wis. Stats. § 23.33(8)(d), the following restrictions are placed on the use of all-terrain vehicle routes designated by this ordinance.

1. Routes shall be marked with uniform all-terrain vehicle route signs in accordance with Wisconsin Administrative Code § NR 64.12(7). The Juneau County Highway Department has sole responsibility for ATV signage on county highways. No person may do any of the following in regard to signs marking all-terrain vehicle routes:

A. Intentionally remove, damage, deface, move, or obstruct any uniform all-terrain vehicle route or trail sign or standard or intentionally interfere with the effective operation of any uniform all-terrain vehicle route or trail sign.

B. Possess any uniform all-terrain vehicle route or trail sign or standard of the type established by the Department for the warning, instruction or information of the public, unless he or she obtained the uniform all-terrain vehicle route or trail sign or standard in a lawful manner. Possession

of a uniform all-terrain vehicle route or trail sign or standard creates a rebuttable presumption of illegal possession.

2. ATV operation shall be subject to all provisions of Wis. Stats. § 23.33, which is adopted by reference as a part of this ordinance.

6) ENFORCEMENT

This ordinance shall be enforced by any officer employed by the Juneau County Sheriff's Department or any other law enforcement official as set forth in Wis. Stats. § 23.33(12).

(7) VIOLATIONS/PENALTIES

The penalty for operating an ATV off the roadway of a designated ATV route (i.e., the gravel shoulder, grassy in-slope, ditch, or other highway right-of-way) or violating any other provision of this ordinance shall result in a forfeiture of not less than \$25.00 or more than \$500.00, plus court costs. Citations may be issued in accordance with the deposit schedule set forth in subsection (11) below, which does not include law enforcement training penalties, jail assessments or other applicable costs.

(8) SEVERABILITY

Should any section, subsection, clause, or provision of this ordinance be declared by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

(9) MAINTENANCE

Designation of segments of the Juneau County Highway System as ATV routes does not impose upon the Juneau County Highway Department a greater duty of care or responsibility for maintenance of those segments than for any other segment of county highway. Operators of ATV's on county highways assume all the usual and normal risks of ATV operation.

(10) EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance becomes effective immediately upon passage by the County Board of Supervisors and publication.

The City of New Lisbon, Juneau County, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION I: PURPOSE

The purpose of this ordinance is to amend/create portions of Chapter 478 of the New Lisbon Code pertaining to All-Terrain Vehicles.

SECTION II: PROVISIONS AMENDED/CREATED

Chapter 478, Sections 34.A. (7) and 34.B. (4), are hereby created.

SECTION III: PROVISION AS AMENDED/CREATED

§478-34.A. (7) is hereby created to read as follows:

(7) Residential access. Full-time residents of the City of new Lisbon are permitted to ride their ATV-UTV directly to and from their residence and the closest point where they can join an ATV-UTV route.

§478-34.B. (4) is hereby created to read as follows:

(4) Route four: Bridge Street (STH 80) from Welch Prairie Road to Pigeon Lane; Pigeon Lane to Adams Street (STH 12/16) across Adams Street to private property to Monroe Street; Monroe Street to Taylor Road; Taylor Road to City limits.

SECTION IV: VALIDITY

Should any section, clause or provision of the ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

SECTION V: CONFLICTING PROVISIONS REPEALED

All ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION VI: EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall be in force from and after its introduction and publication as provided by statute.

SECTION VII:

This ordinance becomes a part of Chapter 478 of the City of new Lisbon Code.

Compton went on to tell law enforcement that after the robbery he crossed State Street in Mauston and went to Boberg's Gas and Go where from the bathroom he called for a cab to take him to the Ho-Chunk Casino in Baraboo. He told officers that once at the casino he cashed in \$1500 of the stolen money for gambling chips. By the time law enforcement caught up with him Compton stated he had spent \$2800. At the time of his arrest Compton was carrying \$865.81, including a \$100 Ho-Chunk gambling chip. The time frame from when the robbery occurred to his arrest was just over six hours. Aiding in locating Compton was pictures attained from surveillance cameras at the bank and the Mauston Police Department posting those photos to social media. That information quickly led to Compton being identified by an individual at the casino.

School funding in proposed State Budget

Governor's proposed budget freezes school district revenue limits in both years. As school leaders know, the state imposes revenue limits on school districts that limit how much school districts can raise and spend from a combination of state general aids and local property taxes.

If revenue limits are frozen at current levels as they are under the proposed budget, it doesn't matter how much additional state aid a district receives, because it won't be able to spend a dollar more per pupil next year or the year after that than it did this year.

This simple equation illustrates this principle: Revenue Limits minus State General Aid = Property Tax Levy

If revenue limits are unchanged and state aid increases, the property tax levy goes down.

Although the proposed budget would provide no in-

1,000 students it will lose \$150,000, etc.

The only way for a school district to make up for this lost aid is to go to referendum to ask voters for permission to exceed the district's revenue limit.

It should be noted that the proposed budget would restore per pupil aid funding in 2016-17 on a one-time basis at a slightly increased level (\$141.9 million or roughly \$165 per pupil). The proposed budget is silent about whether per pupil aid would continue beyond 2016-17.

The budget bill also provides an additional \$105.6 million in each year of the two-year budget to increase the school levy tax credit. Although this tax credit sounds like it has something to do with money for schools, its only connection to school budgets is that it is calculated based on school levies.

ORDINANCE NO. 408**

**AN ORDINANCE CREATING WELLHEAD PROTECTION (WHP) BY
ESTABLISHING LAND USE RESTRICTIONS WITHIN THE CITY OF ELROY
TO PROTECT THE CITY'S GROUNDWATER AQUIFER AND MUNICIPAL
WATER SUPPLY**

The Common Council of the City of Elroy, Juneau County, Wisconsin do ordain as follows:

SECTION 5-5-3. Title of Ordinance. This Ordinance shall be known, cited and referred to as the "Wellhead Protection Ordinance" (hereinafter referred to as "WHP Ordinance").

SECTION 5-5-3

1. Purpose, Authority and Application

- (a) **Purpose.** Residents in the City of Elroy depend exclusively on groundwater for a safe drinking water supply. Certain land use practices and activities can seriously threaten or degrade groundwater quality. The purpose of this WHP Ordinance is to institute land use regulations and restrictions to protect the City's Municipal water supply and well fields, and to promote the health, safety and general welfare of the residents of the City of Elroy.
- (b) **Authority.** Statutory authority of the City to enact these regulations was established by the Wisconsin Legislature in ss. 62.23(7)(a) and (c), Wis. Stats. Under these statutes, the City has the authority to enact this ordinance, effective in the incorporated areas of the City, to encourage the protection of groundwater resources.
- (c) **Application.** The regulations specified in this WHP Ordinance shall apply within the City's corporate limits.

2. Definitions

- (a) **Aquifer.** "Aquifer" means a saturated, permeable, geologic formation that contains, and will yield, significant quantities of water.
- (b) **Existing facilities.** "Existing facilities" means current facilities, practices and activities which may cause or threaten to cause environmental pollution within that portion of the City's wellhead protection area that lies within the corporate limits of the City. Existing facilities include but are not limited to the type listed in the Department of Natural Resources' form 3300-215, Public Water Supply Potential Contaminant Use Inventory Form which is incorporated herein as if fully set forth [consult your municipal attorney regarding incorporation by reference Form 3300-215.].
- (c) **Recharge Area.** "Recharge area" means the land area which contributes water to a well by infiltration of water into the subsurface and movement with groundwater toward the well. This area extends beyond the corporate limits of the City of Elroy.
- (d) **Groundwater Protection Overlay District.** "Groundwater Protection Overlay District" means that portion of the recharge area for the city wells that lies within the city limits as shown in the map attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein as if fully set forth.
- (e) **Well Field.** "Well field" means a piece of land used primarily for the purpose of supplying a location for construction of wells to supply a municipal water system.

3. Groundwater Protection Overlay District

(a) Separation Distances. The following minimum separation distances shall be maintained within the Groundwater Protection Overlay District.

- i. Fifty feet between a well and storm sewer main.
- ii. Two hundred feet between a well and any sanitary sewer main, sanitary sewer manhole, lift station or single family residential fuel oil tank. A lesser separation distance may be allowed for sanitary sewer mains where the sanitary sewer main is constructed of water main materials and joints and pressure tested in place to meet current American Waterworks Association (AWWA) C600 specifications. In no case may the separation distance between a well and sanitary sewer main be less than 50 feet.

NOTE: Current AWWA C600 specifications are available for inspection at the office of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, the Secretary of State's office and the office of the Revisor of Statutes.

- iii. Four hundred feet between a well and a septic tank or soil adsorption unit receiving less than 8,000 gallons per day, a cemetery or a storm water drainage pond.
- iv. Six hundred feet between a well and any gasoline or fuel oil storage tank installation that has received written approval from the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (hereafter SPS) or its designated agent under SPS 340, Wisconsin Administrative Code.
- v. One thousand feet between a well and land application of municipal, commercial or industrial waste; boundaries of a landspreading facility for spreading of petroleum-contaminated soil regulated under NR 718 while that facility is in operation; industrial, commercial or municipal waste water lagoons or storage structures; manure stacks or storage structures; and septic tanks or soil adsorption units receiving 8,000 gallons per day or more.
- vi. Twelve hundred feet between a well and any solid waste storage, transportation, transfer, incineration, air curtain destructor, processing, wood burning, one time disposal or small demolition facility; sanitary landfill; any property with residual groundwater contamination that exceeds NR 140 enforcement standards that is shown on the Department of Natural Resources' geographic information system registry of closed remediation sites; coal storage area; salt or deicing material storage area; gasoline or fuel oil storage tanks that have not received written approval from Commerce or its designated agent under SPS 340, Wisconsin Administrative Code; bulk fuel storage facilities; and pesticide or fertilizer handling or storage facilities.

(b) Two Overlay District Zones. The Districts are hereby called Zone A and Zone B.

- i. Zone A. Identified as the primary source of water for the municipal well aquifer and as the area most likely to transmit groundwater contamination to the municipal wells. Zone A is the most restrictive zone.
- ii. Permitted uses - Zone A. The following uses are permitted uses within the groundwater protection Zone A. Uses not listed shall be considered prohibited uses:
 - (1) Parks, provided there is no on-site waste disposal or fuel storage tank facilities associated with this use.
 - (2) Playgrounds.
 - (3) Wildlife areas.
 - (4) Non-motorized trails, such as bike, skiing, nature and fitness trails.

- (5) Residential, commercial and industrial property, which is municipally sewerred, and free of flammable and combustible liquid and underground storage tanks (USTs).
- iii. Zone B. Identified as a secondary source of water for the municipal wells because of the large cone of depression and a greater time of travel. Zone B is less restrictive than Zone A.
- iv. Permitted Uses - Zone B. The following uses are permitted uses within the groundwater protection Zone B. Uses not listed shall be considered prohibited uses:
 - (1) All uses listed as permitted uses in Zone A.
 - (2) Above-ground petroleum product storage tanks less than 660 gallons. All new or replaced tanks shall be installed in compliance with SPS 340, Wisconsin Administrative Code.
 - (3) Residential, commercial and industrial property which is municipally sewerred or has a state-approved sewer and septic system.
- v. Mapping. The location and boundaries of the zoning districts established by this Ordinance are set forth on the attached Exhibit "A" which is incorporated herein and hereby made a part of this Ordinance. Said map, together with everything shown thereon and all amendments thereto, shall be as much a part of this Ordinance as though fully set forth and described herein.

4. Review of Permit Application

- (a) The City of Elroy Utility Commission shall review all requests for approval of permits for land uses in the Groundwater Protection Overlay District. All determinations shall be made by the City of Elroy Utility Commission within sixty (60) days of any request for approval, provided however, that this sixty (60) day period of limitation may be extended by the City of Elroy Utility Commission for "good cause", as determined in the sole and absolute discretion of the City of Elroy Utility Commission.
- (b) Upon reviewing all requests for approval, the City of Elroy Utility Commission shall consider all of the following factors:
 - i. The City's responsibility, as a public water supplier, to protect and preserve the health, safety and welfare of its citizens.
 - ii. The degree to which the proposed land use practice, activity or facility may seriously threaten or degrade groundwater quality in the City of Elroy or the City's recharge area.
 - iii. The economic hardship which may be faced by the landowner if the application is denied.
 - iv. The availability of alternative options to the applicant, and the cost, effect and extent of availability of such alternative options.
 - v. The proximity of the applicant's property to other potential sources of contamination.
 - vi. The then existing condition of the City's groundwater public water wells and well fields, and the vulnerability to further contamination.
 - vii. The direction of flow of groundwater and other factors in the area of the applicant's property which may affect the speed of the groundwater flow, including topography, depth of soil, extent of aquifer, depth to water table and location of private wells.
 - viii. Any other hydrogeological data or information which is available from any public or private agency or organization.
 - ix. The potential benefit, both economic and social, from the approval of the applicant's request for a permit.

- (c) Any exemptions granted will be made conditional and may include environmental and/or safety monitoring which indicates whether the facility may be emitting any releases or harmful contaminants to the surrounding environment. The facility will be held financially responsible for all environmental cleanup costs. The City of Elroy Utility Commission may require that a bond be posted for future monitoring and cleanup costs if deemed necessary at the time of granting an exemption.
- (d) The applicant shall be solely and exclusively responsible for any and all costs associated with the application, including all of the following:
 - i. The cost of an environmental impact study if so required by the City of Elroy or its designee.
 - ii. The cost of groundwater monitoring or groundwater wells if required by the City of Elroy or its designee.
 - iii. The costs of an appraisal for the property or other property evaluation expense if required by the City of Elroy or its designee.
 - iv. The costs of City's employee's time associated in any way with the application based on the hourly rate paid to the employee multiplied by a factor, determined by the City, representing the City's costs for expenses, benefits, insurance, sick leave, holidays, overtime, vacation and other similar benefits.
 - v. The cost of City equipment employed.
 - vi. The cost of mileage reimbursed to the City employees.

5. Requirements for Existing Facilities and Land Uses

- (a) Existing facilities shall provide copies of all Federal, State and local facility operation approvals or certificates and ongoing environmental monitoring results to the City of Elroy.
- (b) Existing facilities shall provide additional environmental or safety monitoring as deemed necessary by the City of Elroy Utility Commission, specifically including the production of any and all environmental statements detailing the extent of chemical use and storage on the property.
- (c) Existing facilities shall replace equipment or expand in a manner that improves the existing environmental and safety technologies already in existence.
- (d) Existing facilities shall have the responsibility of devising and/or filing with the City of Elroy, a contingency plan satisfactory to the Utility Commission for the immediate notification of the appropriate City of Elroy officers in the event of an emergency.
- (e) Property owners with an existing agricultural use shall be exempt from requirements of this Ordinance as they relate to restrictions on agricultural uses, provided however, that such exemption shall only apply to the property owners in existence at the time of passage of the Ordinance and this exemption shall not constitute a covenant running with the land.

6. Enforcement and penalties

- (a) In the event an individual and/or facility causes the release of any contaminants which endanger the Groundwater Protection Overlay District, the individual/facility causing said release shall immediately cease and desist, and provide clean-up satisfactory to the City of Elroy.
- (b) The individual/facility shall be responsible for all costs of cleanup and the City of Beautiful consultant fees at the invoice amount plus administrative costs for oversight, review and documentation, including all of the following:
 - i. The cost of City employees' time associated in any way with the clean-up based on the hourly rate paid to the employee multiplied by a factor determined by the City, representing the City's cost for expenses,

benefits, insurance, sick leave, holidays, overtime, vacation, and similar benefits.

- ii. The cost of City equipment employed.
 - iii. The cost of mileage reimbursed to the City employees attributed to the clean-up.
- (c) Following any such discharge, the City may require additional test monitoring or other requirements as outlined in Section 6 and 7 herein.
- (d) Violations: It shall be unlawful to construct or use any structure, land or water in violation of this Ordinance. Any person who is specifically damaged by such violations may institute appropriate action or proceeding to enjoin a violation of this Ordinance.
- (e) Penalties. Any person, firm or corporation who fails to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit not less than One Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$500.00) plus the costs of the prosecution for each violation, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, shall be imprisoned in the County Jail until payment thereof, but not exceeding thirty (30) days, or in the alternative, shall have such costs added to their real estate property tax bill as a lien against the property. Each day a violation exists or continues shall constitute a separate offense.

7. Severability Clause

- (a) If any section, subsection, sentence, clause paragraph or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, or other applicable administrative or governing body, such decision shall not affect the validity of any other section, subsection, sentence, clause, paragraph or phrase or portion thereof. The Common Council of the City of Elroy hereby declares that they would have passed this Ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, paragraph or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more other sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, paragraphs, or phrases may be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

8. All Ordinances in conflict with the foregoing are hereby repealed or amended to read consistent with this Ordinance.

9. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 409**

**TO PROVIDE A PROGRAM FOR PROTECTING THE PUBLIC WATER SYSTEM FROM
CONTAMINATION DUE TO BACKFLOW OF CONTAMINANTS THROUGH THE WATER
SERVICE CONNECTION INTO THE PUBLIC WATER SYSTEM**

AN ORDINANCE FOR CROSS CONNECTION CONTROL SECTION 5-5-2

WHEREAS, Chapters NR 810 and SPS 382, Wisconsin Administrative Code, require protection for the public water system from contamination due to backflow of contaminants through the water service connection; and,

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources requires the development and implementation of a comprehensive cross connection control program to effectively prevent the contamination of potable water systems;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Elroy, Juneau County, and State of Wisconsin repeals and recreates the following:

SECTION 5-5-2

1. Definition of Cross Connection

- (a) A cross connection is defined as any physical connection or arrangement between two otherwise separate systems, one of which contains potable water from the City of Elroy's public water system, and the other of which contains water from a private source, water of unknown or questionable safety, or steam, gases, or chemicals, whereby there may be a flow from one system to the other, with the direction of flow depending on the pressure differential between the two systems.

2. Unprotected Cross Connections Prohibited

- (a) No person, firm or corporation may establish or maintain, or permit to be established or maintained, any unprotected cross connection. Cross connections shall be protected as required in ch. SPS 382, Wisconsin Administrative Code.

3. Inspection

- (a) The water utility may inspect, or arrange for an inspection of, property served by the public water system for cross connections.
- (b) The water utility may require a person, firm, or corporation who owns, leases, or occupies property to have their plumbing inspected, at their own expense by a State of Wisconsin Certified Cross Connection Inspector. The frequency of inspections shall be established by the water utility in accordance with Wisconsin Administrative Code. Any unprotected cross connections identified by the inspection shall be promptly corrected.
- (c) Failure to promptly correct an unprotected cross connection shall be sufficient cause for the water utility to discontinue water service to the property, as provided under paragraph 6 of this ordinance

4. Right of Entry

- (a) Upon presentation of credentials, a representative of the water utility shall have the right to request entry, at any reasonable time, to a property served by a

connection to the public water system for the purpose of inspecting the property for cross connections.

- (b) Refusing entry to such utility representative shall be sufficient cause for the water utility to discontinue water service to the property, as provided under paragraph 6 of this ordinance.
 - i. If entry is refused, a special inspection warrant under Wis. Stats. § 66.0119 may be obtained.

5. Provision of Requested Information

- (a) The water utility may request an owner, lessee, or occupant of property served by a connection to the public water system to furnish the water utility with pertinent information regarding the piping systems on the property.
- (b) Refusing to provide requested information shall be sufficient cause for the water utility to discontinue water service to the property, as provided under paragraph 6 of this ordinance.

6. Discontinuation of Water for Violation

- (a) The water utility may discontinue water service to any property wherein any unprotected connection in violation of this ordinance exists, and take other precautionary measures deemed necessary to eliminate any danger of contamination of the public water system.
- (b) Water service may be discontinued; however, only after reasonable notice and opportunity for hearing under Wis. Stats. § 68, except as provided in paragraph 7 of this ordinance. Water service to such property shall not be restored until the unprotected cross connection has been eliminated.

7. Emergency Discontinuance

- (a) If it is determined by the water utility that an unprotected cross connection or emergency endangers public health, safety or welfare, and requires immediate action, and if a written finding to that effect is filed with the City Clerk and delivered to the customer's premises, water service may be immediately discontinued. The customer shall have the opportunity for hearing under Wis. Stats. § 68, within 10 days of such emergency discontinuance.
- (b) Water service to such property shall not be restored until the unprotected cross connection has been eliminated.

8. State Plumbing Code

- (a) The City of Elroy adopts by reference the State Plumbing Code of Wisconsin being Chapter 382, Wisconsin Administrative Code.
- (b) This section does not supersede the State Plumbing Code, but it is supplementary to it.

**CITY OF ELROY
ORDINANCE NO. 410**

**AN ORDINANCE FOR WELL ABANDONMENT AND WELL OPERATION PERMIT
SECTION 5-5-1**

WHEREAS, ch. NR 810.16, Wisconsin Administrative Code, directs suppliers of water for municipal water systems to require the abandonment of all unused, unsafe or noncomplying wells located on the premises served by their system, and to provide a permit system to allow retention of safe and code complying wells, by local ordinance or water utility rule, to eliminate sources of unsafe water and to prevent such wells from becoming channels for vertical movement of contaminated water and to eliminate all existing cross-connections and prevent all future cross connections.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Elroy, Juneau County, and State of Wisconsin repeals and recreates the following:

SECTION 5-5-1

1. Purpose

- (a) To protect public health, safety and general welfare and to prevent contamination of groundwater by assuring that unused, unsafe or noncomplying wells or wells which act as conduits for contamination of groundwater or wells which may be illegally cross-connected to the municipal water system, are properly maintained or abandoned.

2. Applicability

- (a) This Ordinance applies to all wells located on premises served by the City of Elroy municipal water system. Utility customers outside the jurisdiction of the municipal system may be required under contract agreement or utility rule to adopt and enforce equivalent ordinances within their jurisdictions for purpose stated in 1.(a) above.

3. Definitions

- (a) Municipal water system – means a community water system owned by a city, village, county, town, town sanitary district, utility district, public inland lake and rehabilitation district, municipal water district or a federal, state, county, or municipal owned institution for congregate care or correction, or a privately owned water utility serving the foregoing.
- (b) Noncomplying – means a well or pump installation which does not comply with s. NR 812.42, Wisconsin Administrative Code, Standards for Existing Installations, and which has not been granted a variance pursuant to s. NR 812.43, Wisconsin Administrative Code.
- (c) Pump installation – means the pump and related equipment used for withdrawing water from a well, including the discharge piping, the underground connections, pitless adapters, pressure tanks, pits, sampling faucets and well seals or caps.
- (d) Unsafe well or pump installation – means one which produces water which is bacteriologically contaminated or contaminated with substances which exceed the drinking water standards of chs. NR 140 or 809, Wisconsin Administrative Code, or for which a Health Advisory has been issued by the Department of Natural Resources.

- (e) Unused well or pump installation – means one which is not used or does not have a functional pumping system.
- (f) Well – means a drillhole or other excavation or opening deeper than it is wide that extends more than 10 feet below the ground surface constructed for the purpose of obtaining groundwater.
- (g) Well abandonment – means the proper filling and sealing of a well according to the provisions of s. NR 812.26, Wisconsin Administrative Code.

4. Abandonment Required

- (a) All wells on premises served by the municipal water system shall be properly abandoned in accordance with Section 6 of this ordinance by September 30, 2015 or not later than 90 days after connection to the municipal water system, unless a valid well operation permit has been issued to the well owner by the City of Elroy under terms of Section 5 of this ordinance.

5. Well Operation Permit

- (a) Owners of wells on premises served by the municipal water system wishing to retain their wells for any use shall make application for a well operation permit for each well not later than 90 days after connection to the municipal water system. The City of Elroy shall grant a permit to a well owner to operate a well for a period not to exceed 5 years providing all conditions of this section are met. A well operation permit may be renewed by submitting an application verifying that the conditions of this section are met. The City of Elroy or its agent, may conduct inspections and water quality tests or require inspections and water quality tests to be conducted at the applicant's expense to obtain or verify information necessary for consideration of a permit application or renewal. Permit applications and renewals shall be made on forms provided by the Clerk. All initial and renewal applications must be accompanied by a fee set forth in the City's Fee Schedule.
- (b) The following conditions must be met for issuance or renewal of a well operation permit:
 - i. The well and pump installation shall meet the Standards for Existing Installations described in s. NR 812.42, Wisconsin Administrative Code. The well and pump system shall be evaluated by a licensed well driller or pump installer and certified on the Wisconsin Well and Pressure System Inspection Form 3300-221 to comply with ch. NR 812 subch. IV, prior to issuing the initial permit and no less than every 10 years afterwards.
 - ii. The well and pump shall have a history of producing safe water evidenced by at least 1 coliform bacteria sample. In areas where the Department of Natural Resources has determined that groundwater aquifers are contaminated with substances other than bacteria, additional chemical tests may be required to document the safety of the water.
 - iii. There shall be no cross-connections between the well's pump installation or distribution piping and the municipal water system.
 - iv. The water from the private well shall not discharge into a drain leading directly to a public sewer utility unless properly metered and authorized by the sewer utility.
 - v. The private well shall have a functional pumping system.
 - vi. The proposed use of the private well shall be justified as reasonable in addition to water provided by the municipal water system.

6. Abandonment Procedures

- (a) All wells abandoned under the jurisdiction of this ordinance shall be done according to the procedures and methods of s. NR 812.26, Wisconsin Administrative Code. All debris, pumps, piping, unsealed liners and any other obstructions which may interfere with sealing operations shall be removed prior to abandonment.
- (b) The owner of the well, or the owner's agent, may be required to obtain a well abandonment permit prior to any well abandonment and shall notify the Clerk at least 48 hours in advance of any well abandonment activities. The abandonment of the well may be observed or verified by personnel of the municipal system.
- (c) An abandonment report form, supplied by the Department of Natural Resources, shall be submitted to the Clerk and the Department of Natural Resources within 30 days of the completion of the well abandonment. The form must be completed by the licensed well driller, pump installer, or certified operator performing the abandonment.

7. Penalties

- (a) Any well owner violating any provision of this ordinance shall upon conviction be punished by forfeiture of not less than fifty (\$50) dollars nor more than five hundred (\$500) dollars and the cost of prosecution. Each day of violation is a separate offense. If any person fails to comply with this ordinance for more than 30 days after receiving written notice of the violation, the municipality may impose a penalty and cause the well abandonment to be performed and the expense to be assessed as a special tax against the property.
