

**TYPE E NOTICE - VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT
GENERAL AND PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION
NOVEMBER 3, 2020**

Any qualified elector, unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may ask to vote an absentee ballot. A qualified elector is a person who is a U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on election day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where the person wishes to vote at least 28 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.

**TO OBTAIN AN ABSENTEE BALLOT
YOU MUST MAKE A REQUEST IN WRITING**

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary election or both. You may also submit a written request in the form of a letter or you may apply for an absentee ballot online at MyVote.wi.gov. Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different, and your signature. You may make application for an absentee ballot in person, by mail, by fax, by email, or at MyVote.wi.gov.

Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military or hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

You can also personally go to the clerk's office, complete a written application, and vote an absentee ballot in person.

BEFORE THE POLLS CLOSE AT 8:00 P.M. ON NOVEMBER 3, 2020. ANY
BALLOTS RECEIVED AFTER THE POLLS CLOSE WILL NOT BE COUNTED.**
